

Dr Irene Hoffmann



Since 2002, Dr Hoffmann (PhD) is Chief, Animal Production Service of the Animal Production and Health Division, Agriculture and Consumer Protection Department of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) in Rome. She is leading and managing several programmes and professional groups; she has developed a wide portfolio of livestock development activities, including animal product processing, quality and safety along the value chain. She enhanced FAO's role in institution and capacity building and fostered collaboration with intergovernmental organizations, private sector organizations, NGOs, academia and other relevant players. Dr Hoffmann specifically leads FAO's Animal Genetic Resources Programme which included the development of the first Report on the State of the World's Animal Genetic Resources and the adoption, in 2007, of the Global Plan of Action for Animal Genetic Resources, and its implementation since.

Dr Hoffmann holds a Ph.D. from Hohenheim University and an MSc in Animal Science from Göttingen University. Before joining FAO, Dr Hoffmann was assistant professor at the Institute of Animal Breeding and Genetics, Giessen University, where she coordinated several international research programmes.

She has organized international conferences and published extensively in refereed journals, books and conference papers on scientific and policy topics, and she has served in various scientific advisory committees and review panels.
